FAITH GOD'S UNLIMITED ABILITIES

Introduction - The world we live in defines Faith as complete trust or confidence in someone or something. The Bible contains a clear definition of faith in Hebrews 11:1: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."



Simply put, the definition of Faith is Trusting in Something you Cannot Explicitly Prove.

The definition of faith contains two aspects: intellectual assent and trust. Intellectual assent is believing something to be true. Trust is actually relying on the fact that the something is true. That belief is NOT based in Proof. A chair is a great illustration of these aspects. Intellectual assent is recognizing that a chair is a chair and agreeing that it is designed to support a person who sits on it. Trust is actually sitting in the chair.

The environment of Faith you create determines your existence. The atmosphere around you can boost your Faith or choke it.

Faith Atmosphere is the air in any place and time. It is the feeling of good or evil that the mind receives from a place, condition and/or experience.

• A feeling of evil, doubt, disappointment, "it won't work" and "no one to help me", hinders a Faith from taking root and yielding positive results.

• A feeling of good, trust, optimism, excitement, enthusiasm, expectation and success enhance Faith and create miracles.



Anyone who wants to achieve something in life therefore must be concerned about the atmosphere he creates and permits around him. Atmosphere can aid or can kill Faith. Important to note: Faith is the basis for a relationship with God.

Let us listen carefully to David Eich as he takes us on Spiritual


Journey and consider the Wisdom of Holy Scripture and Catechism. May God give to each one of us the necessary means to complete His Gift of our Unique & Holy Mission.


Other Hollywood productions have captured this same theme. These stories were not fiction. Rudy, an undersized football player who played for Notre Dame; Cinderella Man, the story of James Braddock who became the heavyweight champion of the world; Remember the Titans, about a high school football team that overcame racial tension to win the state championship; Invincible, the story of bartender, Vince Papale, who played for the Philadelphia Eagles; The Rookie, a high school baseball coach's journey to the major leagues long after his careerending injury; Moneyball, Billy Beane's story about a

baseball club's General Manager who never lost faith in his team; and Miracle on Ice, the inspirational epic about the U.S. hockey team that won the gold medal at the 1980 Olympics.

In scripture there are numerous stories where faith overcame doubt. Abraham gave up everything, trusting in the Lord to go to a strange land; Noah built an ark after he received a command from God; Gideon went to war against an army that he had no earthly chance to defeat; David slew the giant, Goliath; and Moses led God's people out of Egypt defying Pharaoh and his army.

Said another way, common sense demands that we "play it safe." But faith demands that we begin to move beyond our comfort zone.

During our journey on this planet we will encounter multiple opportunities to overcome doubt through the gift of faith. Should you accept the job transfer? Should you and your wife have the baby when doctors are telling you there is a significant chance that your child will be born with a serious birth defect? Should you follow your heart and become a priest? Should you stand up for what you believe in even though your conviction may fall victim to secular cowardice. Perhaps the latter is why Dante, author of The Divine Comedy, placed a number of his enemies in the first circle of Hell because of their complacency and refusal to stand up for what is right.



Genesis 22:1-3, 9-12 – Faith is not Commonplace or Ordinary

Sometime afterward, God put Abraham to the test and said to him: Abraham! "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There offer him up as a burnt offering on one of the heights that I will point out to you.

the obvious choice to launch a new cleaning service in the educational market. Though his marketing plan contained all the usual strategies, months of inactivity and failure was beginning to take its toll. As a result, he scheduled a meeting with the CEO to resign his position.

A day before that meeting, Jeremy received a phone call from a friend who invited him to a state-wide superintendent's dinner. His friend said, "Jeremy, you never know who you might meet." That evening the weather was terrible as blinding snow almost hid a stranger standing in the middle of the road with his hand out holding a business card. Frustrated, Jeremy took the card and gave him a couple of dollars and then proceeded to the convention hall.

The result was the same: no interest, and no hope for an order. Later that evening Jeremy returned to his apartment where he fell on his knees and cried out to God asking the Lord to show him what he should do.

The following morning Jeremy was getting dressed when he noticed the stranger's business card on the kitchen table. Picking up the card he discovered that there was no name, phone number, or email address listed. Instead the card displayed a number of hand signs commonly reserved for those who were deaf. Jeremy threw the card in the trash.

Arriving at corporate headquarters Jeremy proceeded directly to the CEO's office when he was suddenly intercepted by his secretary who handed him a newspaper clipping about an east coast school system requesting RFP's for cleaning services.

A moment later another sales executive came up to Jeremy and handed him a second article from a west coast newspaper about another school system's need for a cleaning contractor. Jeremy immediately said to his secretary, "Mary, please cancel the meeting with the CEO. There is business out there waiting for us!"

When asked how he knew Jeremy responded, "Both systems were schools for the deaf."

Common sense relies on your limited abilities and understanding; Faith relies on God's unlimited abilities.


