ONE SOLITARY LIFE Jesus of Nazareth

Jesus Christ was born some 2000 years ago in very humble circumstances to a young teenage virgin girl named Mary. Twenty centuries have come and gone, and today He is a centerpiece of the human race and leader of the column of progress, nearly 2 billion people claim to be Christians and worship Jesus as their God.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life.

Let us pay close attention to the Scriptures, Catechism and our presentation. May God bless us with His Wisdom, His Work and the wherewithal to complete the specific mission given to each one of us. Amen



Modern Comment

What's the opposite of power and status? It is LOVING RELATIONSHIPS.

This really hit me when I heard about the hundred-yard dash at the Special Olympics several years ago in Spokane, Washington. Nine contestants raced toward the finish line, but about a third of



the way down the track, one of the boys fell and began to cry. While 6 of the 8 other racers continued to push toward the finish line and possible victory, 2 of the youngsters stopped, turned around and headed back for their fallen competitor. They helped him up and then the 3 boys held hands as they walked down the track to cross the finish line together. The crowd rose and gave these youngsters a longer and louder ovation than the winner of the race.

Life is more about the choices we make as we interact with each other. Most of the youngsters chose to go for earthly success – victory in the race – while 2 tossed aside their own dreams in favor of compassion. The crowd responded with enthusiasm because we all yearn to live at a higher level and these racers modeled what that means. They made a different choice.

Jesus wants us to make these kinds of choices. Life constantly presents us with opportunities to choose to love and serve one another. It is not about us. It is about reaching out in love.

Questions to Focus on:

1 In what way did the video "One Solitary Life" speak to you? How can we put the message of the "One Solitary Life" video into this Christmas season?
2 Mother Teresa could have cared less about money, recognition, power and status. She believed "we are here to serve, not to be served". What is your plan
for making the world a better place for having lived here?

It is NOT about us that counts.
It is the Spirit of God that speaks through us that makes a positive difference in the world.

As we Celebrate the Season, may we Remember the Reason.

You are indeed my Lord, God and Savior. Amen. And AMEN.




Prayer is simply talking to God like a friend and should be the easiest thing we do each day.
