Duane Crabbs is a former Cuyahoga Falls and Akron firefighter-paramedic. He and his wife Lisa moved their family of six into the high-crime, impoverished neighborhood of Summit Lake and formed South Street Ministries in 1997.


Over the last seventeen years, South Street Ministries has grown out of their home and created a legacy of good works for our Lord. In that time:

- 1,000+ youths have earned donated and broken bicycles that they helped to fix and repair
- Hundreds of elementary school kids have been regularly fed, loved and tutored.
- The "Summit Lake Neighborhood Association" was founded and nurtured by Crabbs to be a positive force in the community in partnership with the Summit County prosecutor's office.

Duane continues His work by volunteering as a chaplain in the Summit County Jail and the pastor of an interracial fellowship of the broken and recovering. This group meets at the "Front Porch" at 798 Grant St. The Front Porch also houses a Café that employs recovering addicts and ex-offenders and is open from 7-3 Monday through Friday. Duane and Lisa are humbled that all four of their adult children are following in their parent's footsteps in vocation and lifestyle.
