
Did Jesus speak words of bitterness or complaint? Can you imagine him angrily yelling at someone who cut him off with a donkey cart in Jerusalem traffic? (Note that in today's world, the ass is behind the wheel). No, his words were gracious! They were warm and inviting.

Even when he spoke to his enemies, his voice probably cracked with emotions like sadness and frustration rather than fury and hatred. And because of the words he used and the way he spoke them, people flocked to his side.

If you ever doubt that your words—even your smallest comments—have great power, think about the effects that negative words have. Were you ever made fun of as a child? Did anyone ever make an offhand remark that still stings? How long have they stuck with you? These negative comments can fall so carelessly from our lips. We might be quick to criticize or judge, without remembering how deeply words can hurt and limit a person's potential. If negative speech can have such a profound impact, imagine how much more power your words of encouragement, appreciation, and affirmation can have!

BE CAREFUL WITH YOUR WORDS. ONCE THEY ARE SAID, THEY CAN BE ONLY FORGIVEN, NOT FORGOTTEN.

New teachers are trained that for each criticism or correction they give, they should also give at least three positive comments. In Business, we call this technique the 2-1-1 rule when delivering needed criticism. Find 2 positive things to say about an individual, deliver the performance item needing to be corrected, and followup with another positive trait.



Try to put this technique into practice today. For every complaint that slips out, be sure to say three positive things. Encourage your spouse and children and coworkers and neighbors. Thank the cashier at the grocery store. Bless the person who cuts you off in traffic. Try to make all of your words gracious...more so – KIND. You may give the only encouragement that someone receives all day!

"Lord, let my words be gracious like yours." Amen!

A soothing tongue is a tree of life, but a perverse one breaks the spirit. The fool spurns a father's instruction, but whoever heeds reproof is prudent.





-of **rash judgment** who, even tacitly assumes as true without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor;

-of **slander** who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them.
