Catechism *The Desire for Happiness* 1718

Happiness Choice #1 Wealth or Poverty

Question: Which is the greater gift? When you change others or when others change you? Do you have an example that justifies your position?

Happiness Choice #2 **Self or Others**

Question: Can you recall a time when you received the gift of servant leadership?

Happiness Choice #3 **Quality or Quantity**

Question: Can you provide an example when someone whose "presence" meant more than the "time" they gave you?

Happiness Choice #4 **Fidelity or Betrayal**

Question: Please share the most powerful example of fidelity you ever experienced/witnessed.

Happiness Choice #5 Conviction or Complacency

Question: Which is the greater risk? Being complacent to avoid an uncomfortable/embarrassing situation; or standing firm in one's convictions knowing such action will likely lose the respect of others?

Happiness Choice #6 Pride or Proper Pride

Question: Can you recall an experience when the sharing of your talents gave you a greater sense of worth than the adulation you received from the person benefitting from your kindness?

Happiness Choice #7 Forgiveness or Condemnation

Question: Which is more rewarding, to be forgiven or forgive? Please share an experience where you received the gift of forgiveness.

Jesus wants us to make these kinds of choices. Life constantly presents us with opportunities to choose to love and serve one another. It is not about us. It is about reaching out in love.
