



Professor Randy Pausch

Many professors give talks titled "The Last Lecture", especially at commencements. Instructors are asked to consider their demise and to ruminate on what matters most to them. And while they speak, audiences can't help but mull the same question: What wisdom would we impart to the world if we knew it was our last chance? If we had to vanish tomorrow, what would we want as our legacy?

In September of 2006, Professor Randy Pausch was given 3-6 months to live. A year later he delivered a world-class speech on living each day as though it were one's last day on Earth. This last speech is surprisingly Life Giving, Affirming and Inspiring to we Christians as we seek to know Jesus better.



The focus of the speech starts with the statement, "We cannot change the cards we are dealt, just how we play the hand. If I don't seem as depressed or morose as I should be, I'm sorry to disappoint you." The content touches each person where he or she is at in life. It does not disappoint.

In today's presentation of Randy Pausch's Last Lecture, he will convey a special Wisdom and impart knowledge of life that is worthy to consider in a Christian context and purview. It clearly is tied to the Christian Experience and will help acquaint you with some concepts that we must all come to terms with in life: God may call you home to Heaven at any moment. Are you ready?


"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart."

Tomorrow – It is a Mystery, only known by God. Only adjustable, changeable or mutable by yourself.




