BEING A BLESSING OF GOD

The Healing Power of Words

A Blessing is not a Blessing until it is spoken and shared. "I love you." "I am proud of you." "God Bless you." Are words that come from God through us human vessels that have been inspired by His Holy Spirit.

Do not save your loving speeches for your friends till they are dead. Do not write them on their tombstones, speak them rather now instead.

Words are very important to people in our lives. Whether stranger or family, they profoundly impact those around us. They are tools like a hammer: words can build up or tear down.

When you help someone to rise higher, when you hold them up to God; He makes sure that someone else will be there when you need to be held up. When you Bless others, you release the good in them. Your words of Blessing are God's words meant for that person. You become a vessel who breathes God's life. Such words release protection, wisdom, favor, deliverance and all words of increase in life.

This is especially true when God brings people across our paths. A spoken word becomes a blessing when you consider the message that God wants that person to hear. God breathes new life into others' souls through our words.

Blessings that are spoken by an authoritarian figure are even much more magnified. It has incredible power when spoken by somebody who has a God given authority over you.

You fulfill your God given destiny by allowing God's words to reside and thence come from you to others. More so, God promised us that He would be the father to the fatherless. He gave us the authority and power in our words:

Today will Never come again. Be a blessing. Be a friend. Encourage someone. Take time to care. Let your words heal, and not wound.

- To Spread His Blessings

Throughout the Scriptures, we see the power of blessing. It is sought after, fought for and granted as a determining factor in the life of a man. There is something deeply powerful in the blessing of God through another...and there is a deep hunger in the heart of every person for that blessing. God sent forth his word to heal them, and snatched them from the grave. Remember your word to your servant by which you give me hope. This is my comfort in affliction, your promise that gives me life.






A Man who never quits is Never Defeated.
