Just 56 small words. 231 strokes of a pen. First spoken in a culture that was largely illterate, had no regular publications and told their history from voice to ear. There were no Rock Stars, Sports Heroes, Cultural Icons, Facebook, Twitter Accounts or Email. No one created a CD, DVD, YouTube or electonic image of the speaking of those words.

Yet, somehow these words have traversed about 2,000 years of Human History that has seen great tragedies, hopes, failures, ascents of the spirit, wars, births, literature, art, music and concepts. These words have survived air travel, boats that crossed oceans on and under the sea and flights into space.



These words speak to our very hearts in a powerful communication to God. He who is omnicient, all powerful and everywhere at once....right now, has been here forever and is infinite into the future. These tender words speak of forgiveness and mercy. They grace the lips of people who are about to meet God face-to-face and those who pray for a little more time on Earth.

It is a message from Jesus the Man, our brother, to our God. He taught us this and thus it spans Time, Space and Human History. It is the Lord's Prayer that is now given special for each one of us to cherish.

Then Peter, approaching asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.

The Holy Spirit makes us discern between trials, which are necessary for growth of the inner man, and temptation, which leads to sin and death. We must also discern between being tempted and consenting to temptation. Finally, discernment unmasks the lie of temptation, whose object appears to be good, a "delight to the eyes" and desirable, when in reality its fruit is death.

The last petition to our Father is also included in Jesus' prayer: "I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one." It touches each of us personally, but it is always "we" who pray, in communion with the whole Church, for deliverance of the whole human family. The Lord's Prayer continually opens us to the range of God's salvation.






Modern Comment

Scripture is full of assurances that God will hear and answer our prayers. Of course, there's a danger in taking this wonderful truth and turning God into a personal valet, ready to meet our every whim and fancy. In our praying, we have a responsibility to seek God's will. Our wish is not His command.

Perhaps the best way to avoid turning your prayer time into reciting a wish list is to remember that prayer is a real relationship. It's not magic.

God has invited us into a relationship with Him and provided us the means to reach Him, through His Son. When we ask Him for good gifts – something He encourages us to do – we should remember that we're talking to someone who loves us, wants what's best for us, and knows what we really need.

Most importantly, when we go to God in prayer, we are communing with the One who seeks a relationship of love with us.

2 It is said to be careful for what you ask for in prayer as God may grant your desire. Do you have any examples in your life you can share? Both positives and negatives.
3 Any ideas on how we can pray not as an exercise of our will, but as a surrender to God's will?



Send forth your Holy Spirit to guide me in your path. Make me worthy of your love, and teach me how to forgive as you forgave. Amen




Your Will Be Done.


