


This is not the act of opining on political issues or urging governmental actions, etc but instead focused on Relationship Building, man to man, in the light of God's Word, Church Teachings and Saints of God.

1 Samuel 18:1-5

By the time David finished speaking with Saul, Jonathan had become as fond of David as if his life depended on him; he loved him as he loved himself.

Saul laid claim to David that day and did not allow him to return to his father's house. And Jonathan entered into a bond with David, because he loved him as himself. Jonathan divested himself of the mantle he was wearing and gave it to David, along with his military dress, and his sword, his bow and his belt. David then carried out successfully every mission on which Saul sent him. So Saul put him in charge of his soldiers, and this was agreeable to the whole army, even to Saul's own officers.


Sirach 6:5-12, 14-17

A kind mouth multiplies friends, and gracious lips prompt friendly greetings. Let your acquaintances be many, but one in a thousand your confidant. When you gain a friend, first test him, and be not too ready to trust him.

For one sort of friend is a friend when it suits him, but he will not be with you in time of distress. Another is a friend who becomes an enemy, and tells of the quarrel to your shame. Another is a friend, a boon companion, who will not be with you when sorrow comes. When things go well, he is your other self, and lords it over your servants; but if you are brought low, he turns against you and avoids meeting you.

A faithful friend is a sturdy shelter; he who finds one finds a treasure. A faithful friend is beyond price, no sum can balance his worth. A faithful friend is a life-saving remedy, such as he who fears God finds; for he who fears God behaves accordingly, and his friend will be like himself.





John 15:12-13,16-17

This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.

I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you.

This I command you: love one another. The Word of the Lord.

Catechism

1970 - The Law of the Gospel

The Law of the Gospel requires us to make the decisive choice between "the two ways" (The way of Christ "leads to life"; the opposite way "leads to destruction.") and to put into practice the words of the Lord. It is summed up in the Golden Rule, "Whatever you wish that men would do to you, do so to them; this is the law and the prophets."

The entire Law of the Gospel is contained in the "new commandment" of Jesus, to love one another as he has loved us.

Pray don't find fault with the man who limps

Unless you have worn the shoes that hurt

As it did to him when he went astray,
'Twould cause you to falter, too.

This week I will do my best to listen for God's will in my life by:


Creating a daily prayer practice

Asking God for strength to not Judge others


Paying more attention to Blessing those in my life as God intends

Regarding St. Francis, Monk of God, the words are commonly accepted and attributed to St. Francis...even though the first appearance of them took place 200 years after his death.
