Leading the Way

There are many examples of false prophets in history. Some of these gifted charlatans have led people away from family and friends. They have led people to do evil things, like stealing, torture, or even murder. It is amazing how those gifted with charisma can lead others down such a destructive path. GOSPEL REFLECTION 3rd Sunday of Advent

Reflecting on the scriptures

Every “coming” is preceded by the “waiting.” The doctor will return your call...but, first, the waiting. The test results will soon be available...but, first, the waiting. The baby is expected any day...but, now, the waiting. The votes are being tallied and the winner will be announced soon...but, now, the waiting. Hospice has prepared the family and final arrangements have been made...but, now, the waiting.

Some waiting is full of joyful anticipation; other waiting is filled with anxiety. But all waiting seems to play tricks with time, stretching it out, drawing our focused attention to each passing minute or day.

Isaiah acknowledges that knees can become weak, hearts frightened by the waiting. But all of our scriptures today remind us that God comes, keeps faith forever. The seed the farmer plants in the ground will in time produce good fruit.

Like the farmer in the second reading, like John the Baptist in the gospel, we have a part to play while we wait. That for which we wait will arrive in time. Between now and then there is much we can do to prepare for the coming.

Living the gospel

God comes. In some way...each day...God comes. Sometimes we see God in the clear answer to a prayer. Other times, God’s presence is more subtle. It’s felt in the interior invitation to forgive another. In the feeling that this would be a good time to be quiet and pray. In the strength to stretch ourselves a bit farther than ever before toward charity. Each time we fill the waiting with kindness, mercy, patience we prepare for coming of the Lord.

Thank you to everyone who stopped by last Saturday to donate your unwanted Christmas Lights and to the Creation Care crew for putting together this wonderful event. We hope you enjoyed the cookies and hot cocoa! Why recycle Christmas lights? "No matter what the reason, resist the urge to throw old holiday lights in the trash. Christmas lights are made from copper, glass, and plastic—valuable materials that can actually be recycled and reclaimed. Recycling companies collect millions of pounds of old lights every year and ship them to reclamation facilities. The facilities will crush the lights, separate the individual materials, and then bundle those off for reuse. It's a way to "mine" existing products to reduce the need to go after virgin resources—which is why it makes environmental sense." If you missed out, here are some additional ways to recycle your lights before and after Christmas this year.



1. Ship your Christmas lights to be recycled. Visit <https://www.holidayleds.com/christmas-light-recycling-program.aspx> to learn more about how and where to ship them to be recycled.
2. Stores like Home Depot, Walmart, and Lowes collect lights during the winter holidays. Check with your stores to find out details.
3. If you have working lights that you no longer need, consider donating to your local Goodwill.

Did you also know you can recycle your real Christmas Trees after you take them down? Stop by your local farm and see if they would like your trees. They can be used for farm animals for food. Or check with your city departments to see what uses they might have, like composting or mulching.

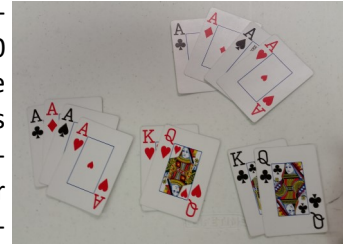
