INTO THE BREACH #6 – MARRIAGE & FAMILY

Revitalizing Men's Family Role

We are being called as Men of Christ to embrace wholeheartedly masculine virtues in an imperfect and broken world. The gravity of our duty as Men of Christ, offers us an invitation to renew Christ-based Masculinity.



Today we will discuss Marriage & Family and how we play a role in that Blessing. There is a father absence crisis in America. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 18.3 million children, 1 in 4, live without a biological, step, or adoptive father in the home.

Consequently, there is a Father Factor in nearly all social ills facing America today. “It is not money, but the family that is the foundation of public life,” observed James Q. Wilson, a renowned professor of government at Harvard University. “As it has become weaker, every structure built upon that foundation has become weaker.”

Those two statements are applicable in light of a new study from Johns Hopkins University sociologist Andrew Cherlin. He found that, over the past 25 years, non-marital childbearing has greatly increased among women of all educational levels, with the sharpest percentage increase among women who hold a bachelor’s degree or higher.

Of that group, 24.5% of women who were between the ages of 32 and 38 in 2017-2018 were not married when they had their first child. In contrast, in 1996, only 4% of women in that age group were not married when they gave birth for the first time. (Compared to women of other educational levels, college-educated women were more likely to be married when they had their second child.)



Interestingly, 1996 was just four years after then-Vice President Dan Quayle was ridiculed for his “Murphy Brown” speech in which he criticized American culture’s glamorization of single parenting, especially among highly educated women. Now, a couple of decades later, many sociologists from across the political spectrum agree with the former vice president. Unfortunately, the social trends Quayle recognized have resulted in the past quarter-century’s six-fold explosion in unmarried mothers among college-educated women.

How do men feel about this? What does the battle for a Family’s Soul entail? What are some of the key threats to healthy family life today? In what ways do some men “retreat from the battlefield altogether” in this struggle for family?




