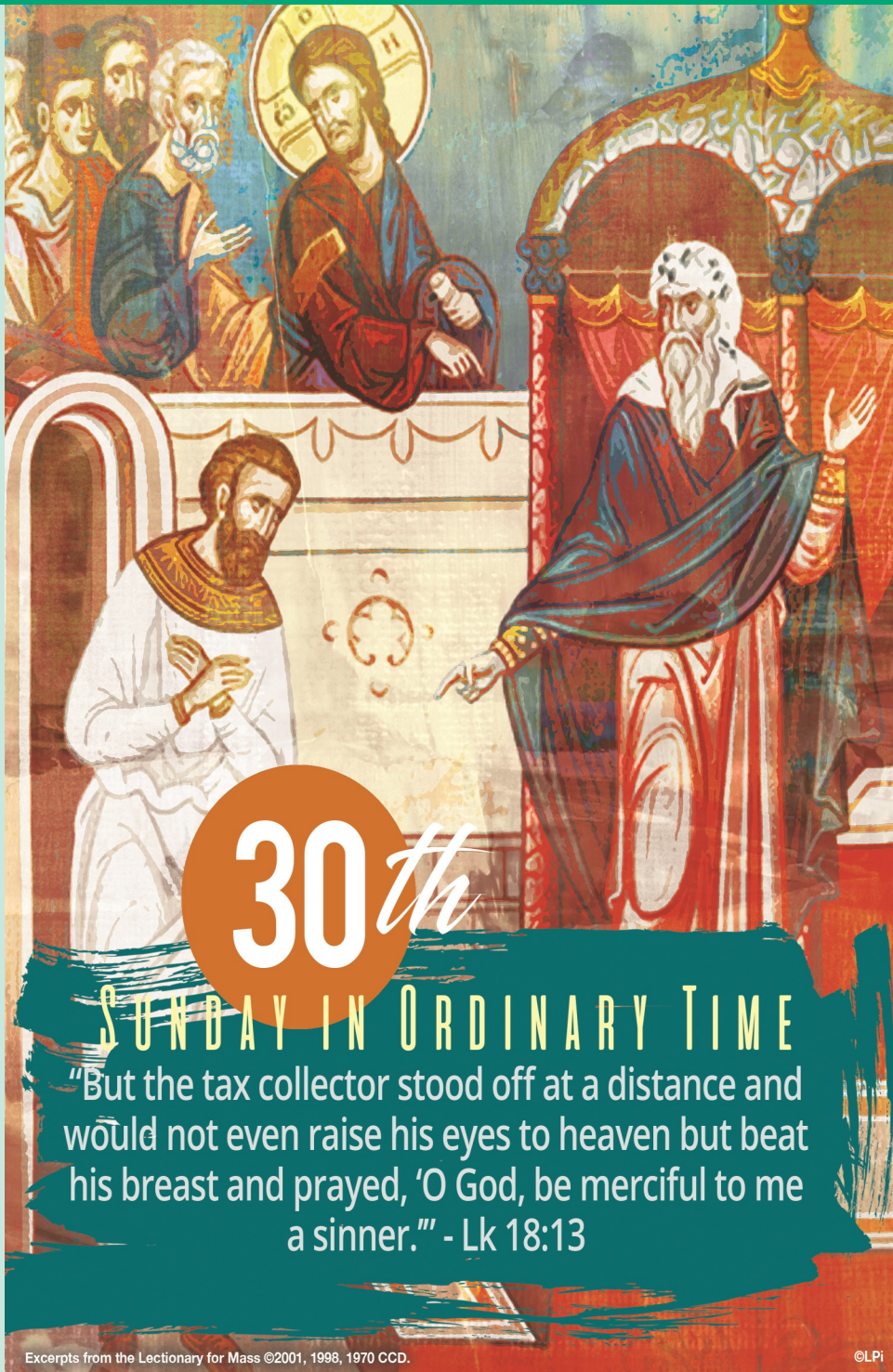

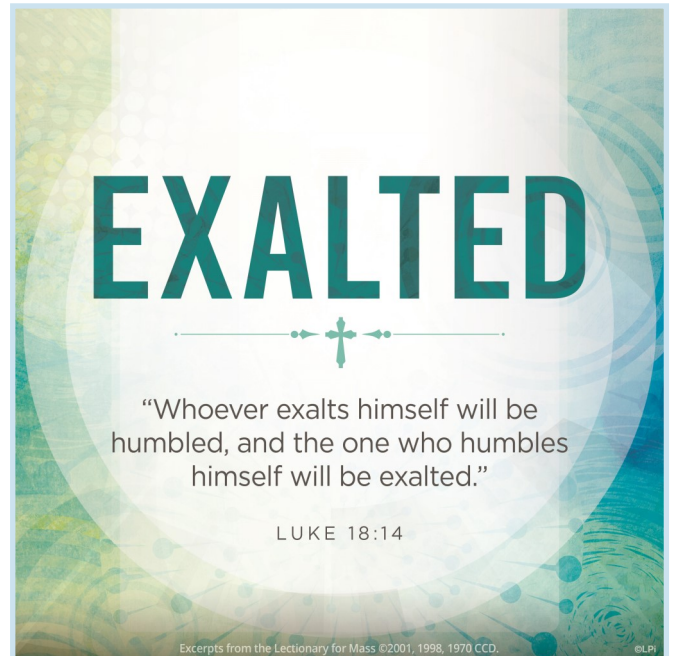

Gospel Reflection

The Paradox of the Parable

One day, according to Luke, Jesus decides to tell a story. His audience, intentionally, are the **Pharisees**. (...those religious leaders who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else...) And Jesus begins: Two people went up to the Temple to pray. One was a **Pharisee**. One was a **tax collector**. (Note: tax collectors were despised by the people for their dishonest and corrupt ways.)

In his prayer, the Pharisee thanks God for creating him to be **not** like the rest of humanity—greedy, dishonest, adulterous—but **virtuous** to a fault. Meanwhile, the lowly tax collector won't even raise his eyes heavenward. In the back of the Temple he simply prays, "**O God, be merciful to me, a sinner.**" Jesus concludes the parable by pointedly saying, only the tax collector went home **justified**, for the "**one who humbles himself will be exalted.**"

What? Astonishment gripped the crowd. Maybe appearances and status aren't what they seem to be. How could Jesus be raising up for admiration a hated tax collector? In some ways the Pharisee was only speaking the truth about himself, as was the tax collector. Right? What is this parable teaching us?

More importantly, with whom do we identify in this story? Are we sometimes like the confident Pharisee, comfortable with our response to the Gospel? Happy with the good deeds we are doing but quietly judging others for their seemingly disordered pursuits? And who are the "tax collectors" in our estimation? Those whom we judge for a variety of reasons, because of their politics, status, nationality, occupation? Do our biases blind us to the possibility of goodness in them?

Jesus does indeed present us with a paradox, a "**situation that combines contradictory qualities.**" Jesus is good at doing that...forcing us to wrestle with the complexities of life as we make judgements about one another. Let us resolve to **wrestle** with the challenges this parable presents as we continue our journey of discipleship. May we one day be able to say with St. Paul:

*"I have competed well; I have finished the race;
I have kept the faith."*

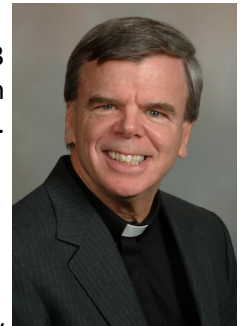

September 27, 2022**

Do you recognize the name of Bob Propst, inventor of the office cubicle or Mary Jackson, Katherine Johnson and Dorothy Vaughan? These women were the mathematicians for NASA that propelled John Glenn into space. Scott offered a special tribute to a retiring unsung hero who has served as Business Manager for St. Hilary, Lou Camerato! His work has been behind the scenes yet exceptional! Scott ended with a brief prayer: Bless the Silent Ones, Unrecognized Ones, Bless them all!

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by Karen Sears.

Financial Report: Lou Camerato and Trey Baker reported financial information through September 26, 2022. The offertory indicates the parish is ahead by \$32, 757.00 or 14.2% for the new fiscal year. As of August 31, the parish is operating with a surplus of \$139,000 compared to a loss of \$30,000 at the same time last year. Finances for the parish are going well. All but one item from capital expenditures from the summer classroom refresh projects have been paid. We are waiting for final delivery on an item.
