Faith Formation

Gospel Reflection

So much to reflect on in today's Scriptures.

We begin with the words of Jesus in Matthew's gospel. Note that he is once again addressing the **religious leaders** of his day **(chief priests and elders)**. He tells them a story that could leave us scratching our heads. It is about two sons. One son absolutely refuses to do the work his father asks of him..."I will not..." but ends up doing it anyway. The other son says "Yes, sir" but does not follow through. Jesus asks: Who did the father's will? His listeners decide it was the son who changed his mind. (Some parents might think neither son responded well.)

Then Jesus moves on from this story to an **indictment** of his listeners: "Amen I say to you, **tax collectors and prostitutes** are entering the kingdom of God before you." Really? The **religious leaders** must have been astounded. Scripture scholars tell us that the parable of the two sons was Jesus' way of pointing out the failings of the religious leaders of his day...men whose words were not matched by their deeds.

So let us reflect on this. **Words matter**, especially in this time of political and religious controversy over what is true and **what is politically or religiously expedient**. We have often been told to consider WWJD when making decisions: "What would Jesus do?" Let us consider this question: **What would Jesus say?** not only to government officials but to our religious leaders concerning many of today's issues: welcoming refugees and migrants, the growing threat to the health of our planet, the high rate of maternal and infant mortality, enacting gun laws to ease gun violence, the sacredness of all human life...

We recall that Jesus did not follow the letter of the religious law during his time on earth. Remember the story of the woman caught in adultery. The law was clear but he chose compassion and conversion over stoning. And he welcomed everyone to the table, saints and sinners alike, causing scandal.

Would Jesus dare ask political leaders to consider ideas like the common good or sacrifice or the impact on our environment, when making decisions? Would he encourage our churches to become more affirming and welcoming? Challenging and painful questions for all who try to live the gospel in today's world! Jesus never said it would be easy.

ELECTION EARLY VOTING & ABSENTEE OPTIONS FOR NOV. 7 Issue 1 and immanent threat to parental rights

A proposed State constitutional amendment, Issue 1, if passed will among other things eliminate parents' right to be notified/consent when a minor child seeks an abortion and legally protect those who help procure an abortion, as well as create a permanent constitutional right to abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. A "NO" vote on this proposed amendment will help prevent policy.

For those unregistered to vote, the last day to register is Oct 10. We will offer Voter Registration after Masses in the Gathering Area and Market St. entrance after Masses Oct7/8. Persons may vote at their normal precinct on election day, Nov 7, 6:30 am to 7:30 pm. In-person early voting is highly encouraged at the Board of Elections and begins Oct 11.

To vote by absentee ballot, a completed absentee ballot application is necessary from the Board of Elections. This request should be made immediately because of deadlines. To obtain an application, go to https:// www.boe.ohio.gov/summit or http://www.boe.ohio.gov/ medina depending on your county. Scroll down and click on the tab for absentee ballot application.
