

# Gospel Reflection

Do you recall the folk song of a few years ago, "Cat's in the Cradle", by Harry Chapin? The song, told from a father's perspective, tells of the birth of his son..."My child arrived just the other day."...through the boy's growing up years..."When you coming home, dad? Can you teach me to throw?" Over the years the son continues to invite his father to be a more active part of his life. If you remember the song, eventually the boy is grown with a family of his own and is now too busy to fit his dad into his life.

In today's gospel a king sends out invitations to his son's wedding feast. Again and again he invites. Again and again his invitations are turned down. And like the busy father in the folk song, the wedding guests refuse the invitation until it's too late.

Just so, the Spirit of God breaks into our lives in countless ways: We see a newspaper article. A memory resurfaces in our mind. A scripture passage speaks to our heart. And we are invited to live the gospel more fully: We are invited to reconcile with someone from whom we have become estranged. We are moved to support a charity or work for a just cause we have previously ignored. We are motivated in a new way to care for our own health, or for our personal relationships, or our spiritual life. A close friend or family member is deeply hurt by a policy or practice and our heart is opened in a way that causes us to rethink some of our own opinions.

In the gospel, the would-be guests who refused the invitation are treated harshly by the king. Not so with our God, who continues constantly to reach out in love to us.

But life is real and the folk song carries some wisdom. Sometimes it's too late. Too late to reconcile, too late to repair that relationship, too late to change your mind... Too late...too late...

# Election Early Voting & Absentee Options for NOV. 7 Issue 1 and immanent threat to parental rights

A proposed State constitutional amendment, Issue 1, if passed will among other things eliminate parents' right to be notified/consent when a minor child seeks an abortion and legally protect those who help procure an abortion, as well as create a permanent constitutional right to abortion potentially throughout pregnancy. A "NO" vote on this proposed amendment will help prevent policy.

Persons may vote at their normal precinct on election day, Nov 7, 6:30 am to 7:30 pm. In-person early voting is highly encouraged at the Board of Elections and begins Oct 11.


To vote by absentee ballot, a completed absentee ballot application is necessary from the Board of Elections. This request should be made immediately because of deadlines. To obtain an application, go to https:// www.boe.ohio.gov/summit or http://www.boe.ohio.gov/ medina depending on your county. Scroll down and click on the tab for absentee ballot application. After completing the application, mail it to your respective Board of Elections: the Summit County Board of Elections, 470 Grant Street, Akron, Ohio 44311 or Medina County Board of Elections, 3800 Stonegate Dr., Suite C, Medina, OH 44256. After a voter receives by mail and completes the absentee ballot, it may be returned as early as possible in person or by mail to the Board of Elections by Nov 6. The best method of mailing is to have the post office weigh it, then you're guaranteed it will have the postmark date (unlike with a stamp or private postage meters that don't contain a postmark, which would invalidate the ballot if not received by the Board of Elections by close of business on election day).

"What ifs" cause us to doubt our choice. A change of any kind might cause a domino effect in other areas of our lives. We all like guarantees but life does't come with a guarantee. At some point, one must have faith. The bible offers several passages concerning faith: Matthew 17:20 "If you have faith of a mustard seed...nothing will be impossible to you."; Mark 11:22, "Have faith in God, truly I say to you..." It is sometimes difficult to have faith when bad things happen. Turn to the Lord. He is always there!

#### Financial Report::

- Offertory as of August is up \$4,500 from this time last year, which is a 3% increase. At this current point, offertory went down a bit in September, but we are still ahead of last year's total by \$1,100.
- The parish is at a surplus of \$392,000 through the first 2 months of the year. The main factor in the surplus is the tax return for \$271,000 that we received and processed in July 2023. Other positive sources include investment income, and the school deficit (55k) being half of our current projections.
- Projects Church roof to hopefully be completed in the next week or so. Final sheet metal trim and the inspection are the final steps to completion.
- Approximately \$1500 in donations from Eucharistic Miracle Display
- School roof is projected to be started in the next week or so as well.
- Bids being gathered for security upgrades in the church and office area.
